DRAW YOUR MUSIC AND MAP OUT YOUR LISTENING

The form of a piece is always easier to remember with visual cues. Get pencil and paper, markers and pens and make a picture of the form and structure of each piece. Twinkle is in ternary form (ABA) just like a peanut butter sandwich - bread, peanut butter, bread.

The style, and mood of a piece is easier to relate to when you can visualize a scene or story and make an emotional connection with the music. Does Lightly Row sound like floating in a boat over a beautiful lake?

Get more specific and draw different shapes for staccato notes and legato notes. Rhythms, instruments, and dynamics can all be illustrated to improve memory and connection to the music.
